- HM updated on Incident with staff member regarding a collision.
- HM reported on Waste disposal complaint from marina resident.
- Sunken Boat from Colne (between Alresford Creek and Wivenhoe) has been recovered. BHC will seek recovery costs from Colchester.
- Inspection Colne Leader had a snap inspection from Maritime and Coastguard Agency (MCA). passed with one deficiency which was a 'no garbage overboard sign'. The inspector had been impressed and took some pictures. He said they will likely feature on the MCA Colchester or national websites and social media as a great example inspection of compliance.

## Maintenance

- Tide Gauge returned to supplier (Valeport); It needs a software update to resolve some known issues.
- Yard concrete apron extended to prepare for the new bin area.
   Access will be for mooring holders, using a fob they already use for showers.
- Placement of new Harbour signage in preparation for Golden Anchor inspection.
- 2 new escape ladders installed with new signage, on fisherman's and whites pontoons.
- Colne explorer and community reach bow door lines replaced as preventative measure.
- Community Reach has a new door winch installed.
- New washing machine installed in showers and toilet block.
- New office radio installed
- New fuel locker instated to create better fuel storage
- Colne leader scrub and underwater repairs
- Spare Port Mark ready to deploy
